What is the Rule of Law

The rule of law is a durable system of laws, institutions, norms, and community commitment that delivers:









Accountability

The government as well as private actors are accountable under the law.

Just Law

The law is clear, publicized, and stable and is applied evenly. It ensures human and procedural rights as well as property and contract rights.

Open Government

The processes by which the law is adopted, administered, adjudicated, and enforced are accessible, fair, and efficient.

Accessible and Impartial Justice

Justice is delivered timely by competent, ethical, and independent representatives and neutrals who are accessible, have adequate resources, and reflect the makeup of the communities they serve.



Factor 2: Absence of Corruption





Priorities for Action on Factor 2

2.1 | Government officials in the executive branch do not use public office for private gain Thailand: 0.43 || Regional Average 0.59, Global Average 0.49,

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.16

2.3 | Government officials in the police and the military do not use public office for private gain

Thailand: 0.47 | Regional Average 0.65, Global Average 0.59

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.18

2.4 | Government officials in the legislative branch do not use public office for private gain


Thailand: 0.25 | Regional Average 0.46, Global Average 0.35

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.21

Recommendations

Priorities for Action on Factor 3

3.1. | Publicized laws and government data

Thailand: 0.44 | Regional Average 0.54, Global Average 0.45

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.10

3.2 | Right to information

Thailand: 0.44 | Regional Average 0.54, Global Average 0.51

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.10

3.3 | Civic participation


Thailand: 0.49 | Regional Average 0.53, Global Average 0.56

3.4 | Complaint mechanisms

Thailand: 0.57 | Regional Average 0.58, Global Average 0.58

Priorities for Action on Factor 6

- 6.2 | Government regulations are applied and enforced without improper influence
 Thailand: 0.53 || Regional Average 0.69, Global Average 0.63


 Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.16
- 6.3 | Administrative proceedings are conducted without unreasonable delay
 Thailand: 0.42 || Regional Average 0.60, Global Average 0.49
 Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.18
- 6.4 | Due process is respected in administrative proceedings Priority#4

 Thailand: 0.26 || Regional Average 0.54, Global Average 0.47

 Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.28
- 6.5 | The government does not expropriate without lawful process and adequate compensation Thailand: 0.48 || Regional Average 0.57, Global Average 0.56



Factor 8: Criminal Justice





Recommendations

Priorities for Action on Factor 8

8.1 | Criminal investigation system is effective

Thailand: 0.38 | Regional Average 0.53, Global Average 0.43

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.15

8.2 | Criminal adjudication system is timely and effective

Thailand: 0.41 | Regional Average 0.56, Global Average 0.47

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.15

8.3 | Correctional system is effective in reducing criminal behaviour

Thailand: 0.27 | Regional Average 0.52, Global Average 0.41

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.25

8.4 | Criminal system is impartial

Thailand: 0.32 | Regional Average 0.48, Global Average 0.47

Difference between Thailand and Regional Average = 0.16
