Justice Needs Survey: Survey (general population)




Scope of the study and methodology

Concept: Justice Needs Survey Methodology: Cross-sectional Quantitative Research Tool: Questionnaire based on HiiL and OECD Respondents: 2,026 randomly selected adult individuals (18-60 yo) Geography: 7 urban areas distributed for the whole country Sampling Methods: Stratified sampling to represent the urban Thai population Data Collection: May – June 2022







Gender patterns observed in legal problems (by nature)



Justice needs change with age and as life as a series of events (by relationships)



Lesson Learn #1:


Justice needs are fragmented. In Thailand, they vary by gender, age, and area. Therefore, generalized or one-size-fits-all justice services or solutions, will not be able to meet the individual justice needs. They must be **targeted** and **customized** to fit the justice needs.


Lesson Learn #2:
